

Carcus Creek Harvest – Frequently Asked Questions

How will pulp be bid on, \$ per MBF or \$ per ton?

Bidding on pulp will be on the \$ per ton. There is some confusion about what the bid deposit amount should be included with the bid. On the Notice of Log Sale the volume of pulp is listed in MBF (thousand board feet). The conversion factor between MBF and ton is 1 MBF equals 10 tons. So the bid deposit should be calculated by $10\% \times (50 \text{ MBF} \times 10) \times (\text{bid value per ton})$ then rounded down to the nearest \$100.

How soon will timber delivery start?

Oregon Department of Forestry notifications have been filed and depending on when the bid qualifications are met and contract signed, timber delivery could begin shortly thereafter. There is an interest in removing material suitable for the manufacture of poles prior to the general harvest of sawtimber. To pre-remove pole material there may be some delay in the delivery of sawlogs.

Is there a way of regulating the amount of wood that will be received to a sawmill?

Contract Section 2710. Log Delivery is the portion of the contract that describes the conditions upon which the Purchaser is expected to accept logs from the Logger. Generally, the Purchaser agrees to accept logs from the logger at the regular scheduled hours of the receiving area. The Purchaser may schedule times at which logs will not be accepted. Again generally, these hauling interruptions shall not exceed 7 consecutive days or 7 total days for the duration of the contract. Please see Section 2710 for more information.

Should bid deposits be per sort or combined if bidding on multiple sorts?

Bid deposits should be submitted on the value of each log sort and not be combined with other sorts. NO Personal or Company Checks will be accepted for the Bid Deposit.
